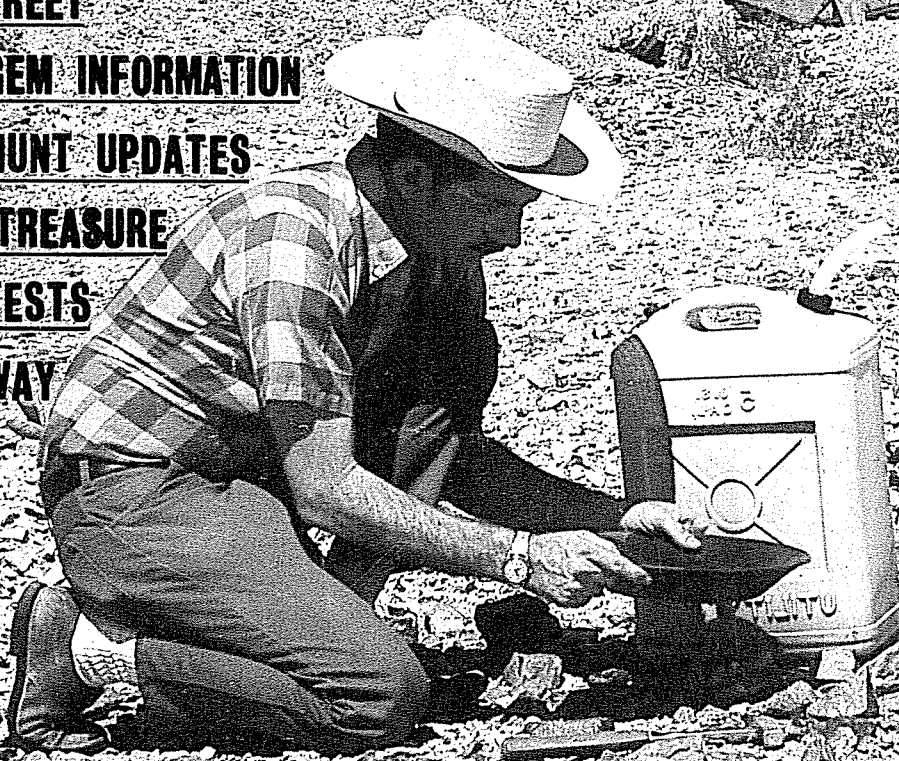

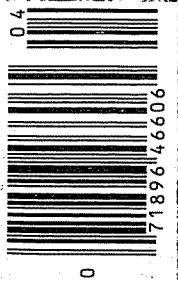

Warrior Basin's Deep South Treasure Hunt - 1980

The Warrior Basin Treasure Hunting Association of Birmingham, Alabama, held their 7th Annual Deep South Treasure Hunt earlier in the hunt season. 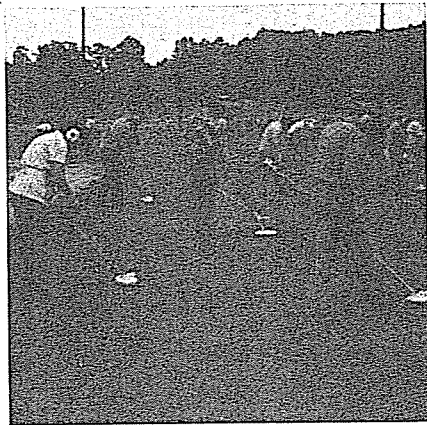
